- In addition to the unique candlelit ambiance of a 19<sup>th</sup>-century Hudson River tavern, **we provide:** Fresh fruit, cheeses, &c.; freshly baked pies; a spiced wine punch\*; musical entertainment by Thaddeus MacGregor; and historical commentary and tall tales by Kearney House director Eric Nelsen.
- If you wish, you may bring your own wine or beer.
- Once your reservation has been made and we have received your payment, we will mail to you additional information, including directions and a map, which you may copy and distribute to your guests.
- *Remember that our goal is for our guests to participate in an authentic 19<sup>th</sup>-century tavern experience. You can expect your clothes to smell of wood smoke after you arrive home from an evening with us—and your head to be filled with all manner of imaginings about life in a different day and age...*



\* Because our punch is well-heated on the fire before we serve it, most all of its alcohol content will have evaporated before it touches any lips—in other words, our punch packs little “punch.”
